



2021 Program Update

2021 continues to be a very challenging year for the poor people in India and Africa as COVID -19 is ravaging lives in many poor areas bringing numerous deaths and untold miseries. We acknowledged the need of the hour and, in our humble way, tried to alleviate the suffering with the limited resources that we could muster. We have several monthly contributors and annual donors who make this happen. Hope for Youth is a 501 c (3) tax exempt organization registered in the state of Kansas, USA (Tax ID: 45-4463125). 100% of the dollars you give goes to the charity with no administrative expense. During the first half of 2021 we initiated or funded programs in India and Africa.

<u>Pandemic Relief Efforts at Christeen Center (Kottayam, Kerala State,</u> <u>India) - our major service collaboration partner</u>

Hope for youth supports many programs for youth through Christeen (Teenagers for Christ), at Kottayam, India. From the inception of the pandemic Christeen was a refuge for quarantining public and inbound expatriates and migrant workers referred by government authorities. At the facilities built with the help of Hope for Youth for boarding services for youth attending programs and orphanage boot camps were converted into lodging people who were returning from Gulf countries who had to be quarantined for 14 days. Those who do not have facilities at their home or have no financial means to support during quarantine are also taken in by Christeen center to be cared for with food and lodging.

In early 2021 when the gatherings of less than 100 people were permitted, Christeen convened limited youth programs to deal with the COVID related issues for youth during the lockdown period providing spiritual uplift. These programs were conducted under a carefully adopted protocol. This resulted in zero occurrence of COVID.

During the summer of 2021, when Covid was ravaging Kerala, Christeen center started a new wing to accommodate patients who have covid and those with mild complications who could not go to hospitals as they were beyond capacity. As of June 2021, there were over 100 Covid patients and 70 quarantined people living in Christeen facility. They are provided with food and care with the funds from benefactors including **Hope for Youth.** These programs were designed to meet the needs of the humanity at a time when local institutions and government were unable to handle the workload and service delivery. So far Christeen served thousands of COVID patients and quarantined public with no incidence of COVID transmission. Local authorities and people who were cared for were extremely appreciative of Christeen's humanitarian intervention in the time of crisis.



Christeen continued its regular retreats and counseling programs over zoom as in-person programs will not begin until the pandemic is over. Here are some pictures of the Christeen activities:



Covid -19 Relief efforts in Adilabad

Adilabad in Telangana State in India is one of the poorest areas of the state and the Bishop of Adilabad, in collaboration with local people, organized one of the finest efforts to mitigate sufferings of the local people who did not have a place to go for food or treatment. They did this by creating a network to distribute food supplies to the hard-to-reach areas. For those who contracted, Covid they opened a center for treatment. Services are provided to mostly tribals and poor villagers of all casts and creed. Here are some pictures they shared:

Gimbi Mission Ethiopia

Hope for Youth is collaborating with Bethany Sisters, a Catholic congregation, who just established a mission post in Gimbi area of Ethiopia. They just started to run a school and a basic clinic. They have an acute need to help local youth to find jobs also. Gimbi, a town in the western region of Ethiopia, is a poor and underdeveloped area with low literacy rate. Hope for Youth has agreed to find sponsors for scholarships for vocational education. In 2020-21 we have funded three candidates for 2 years certification and Commercial Vehicle licensing program.

Hope for Youth funded the rehabilitation of a rundown building and prepared for safe learning center for children. As the facility they had was unsafe, often children were taught in the open ground. The picture below shows the renovated classroom that is safe and secure for children.



Mobile Clinic

Bethany mission runs a small clinic primarily to serve villagers who are poor. The clinic, among other routine medical assistance, also supports treating people with Podoconiosis which is a type of topical lymphoedema very common in the Gimbi areas of Ethiopia due to walking in the irritant soil without shoes or sandals. Podoconiosis patients face significant stigma from their communities Podoconiosis is a poorly understood disease and this has led to widespread misconceptions. People with podoconiosis were also found to have higher mental distress and prone to depression. Apart from prevention through awareness of wearing sandals, the treatment includes daily foot-washing with soap, water and antiseptic, use of a simple emollient, bandaging in selected patients, elevation of the leg, controlled exercises, and use of socks and shoes. As these people are stranded at home due to lack of mobility or social stigma as it is considered as a curse.

Bethany Mission is trying to buy a clinic-equipped van so that they can go to the homes of these patients to give treatment and support. Hope for Youth was able to support in buying this van so that they can reach distant areas for in-home treatments of patients.

<u>Support for Snehibhavan (Adivasi - Dalit Boarding Home) and Adivasi Dalit</u> <u>Women Empowerment Center</u>

In March 2021 we accepted a grant request from Snehibhavan/ Adivasi Women Empowerment Center, in the tribal area near Idukki-Kottayam boarder in Kerala, India. Snehibhavan houses young girls (ages 7 to 19) who are abused or unsafe at home or has no economic means to study or going (walking) to school is extremely hard and unsafe due to animals and other predators. The founder had this idea while serving under the Center for Tribal and Dalit Studies of UNICEF, a UN initiative. The founder Sajini Mathews who herself is a Dalit, is the first one to get high school diploma in that Adivasi district. She has received many awards and recognitions for her service such as *Arali Award, Good Samaritan Awaard, Rosemary Award* among others.



Sajini requested financial assistance as Covid epidemic dried up limited sources of funding she had. The needs were the following:

- 1. Continuing support for children at the boarding facility and their education expenses
- 2. Supporting students who finish high school to go to nursing or other vocation schools
- 3. As they operate in one tenth of an acre land, their dream is to have a half-acre land to be self-sufficient in growing organic vegetables and engaging children to learn valuable lessons of sustainability.

Hope for Youth has funded education expenses for two of the nineteen students and support for fees and expenses for one nursing student. Next year there are couple of students interested in nursing career. A benefactor from Houston has already committed to support one.

Delhi Youth United 4 Christ program Support

Youth United 4 Christ is another Hope for Youth partner who conducts impactful programs for youth at the national level. They had several programs over zoom periodically.
